2009 Canadian National One-Design Championship

The 2009 Canadian National One-Design Championship started off Friday evening at the clubhouse with registration and a review of the rule changes and new scoring system. Thanks to Esther Cogswell (793, crew Maryann Cogswell) for so eloquently summarizing the new rules.

Saturday morning met us with gray skies, wind from the southeast at 8-9 knots, and a 90% chance of showers. After a hearty breakfast put forth by Mike and Les and family we were all raring to go. Our Officials for the weekend, Boyd and Adam Jagoe, sent 7 boats, under the watchful eye of our sailing instructors Sydney Goodfellow and Leah Beveridge, forth for a total of 5 races over the day. Mike and Les Sweet (788), with new aluminum rigging, split the morning races with, Peter Sanford and crew replacement Rick Kidlark (792). We broke for an awesome lunch at the clubhouse, thanks Deb, Sandi and Lynda, and resumed for the afternoon. The three afternoon races would establish our leaders as once again the wins were shared by 788 and 792 with Jeff and Darlene Bishop (795) consistently third. The final race, being an "Olympic Style" course; a triangle followed by a windward/leeward course, tested boat and sailors as wind continued to build to measured gusts of 16 knots. Equipment failure would claim Conny and Jennifer Bishop (781) while a hard gybe and a sudden gust proved too much for Chris and Andrew Dettra (820). Thanks to Tom Goode and Dave Selfridge, and our staff for a quick and safe recovery.

Sunday morning was again overcast with a slightly lighter wind at 6-8 knots. With rain pending we managed two more races. Both races would produce challenges from the middle of the pack, the first, a close second by 781 and the final being led by Steve McDow and Lynda Sanford (827) around all three marks only to succumb to the experienced wind reading of 788.
